Village Community Center 'Dayavarsha' at Hebbur

A Village Community Centre was opened to public at Hebbur (Kunigal-Tumkur Road) on 24 May 2016. This facility consists of a purification & coin-operated drinking water dispensing plant, a youth counselling centre and a training & tailoring unit for unemployed women and has been established on panchayat land leased to St. Gregorios Dayabhavan.

The Centre was inaugurated by Sri. Suresh Gowda (MLA, Tumkur Rural Constituency) in the presence of HG Dr. Yuhanon Mar Chrysostomos (President, St. Gregorios Dayabhavan), Sri.Nagaraju (PDO, Hebbur) and Sri. Papanna (Pradhana Archakaru), Sri.Chikkanna Swamy Kshethra, Sri. Raje Gowda (Member, Zilla Panchayat), Smt. Lakshmidevamma (President, Grama Panchayat, Hebbur), Sri. Chittappa (Father of late Nagesh) and Sri. H.G. Madhu (Member, Taluk Panchayat, Tumkur).







The Reverse Osmosis water purification plant (500 litre /hour, 2000-litre storage capacity) offers public & consumers potable water through a coin-operated dispensing system. 4000 litres of water are dispensed daily at subsidized cost, a beneficial service at this water-starved region. Raw water is supplied by the Village Panchayat.

In the first floor, the center offers counselling to village youth for education and employment opportunities, while a tailoring facility, established in the second floor, assists poor unemployed women with income generating schemes.

District AIDS Prevention and Control Unit (DAPCU) meets in Dayasparsha Hospital 30 May 2016

District AIDS Prevention and Control Unit's (DAPCU/ICTC) monthly meeting was held in our Dayasparsha Hospital (a specialty hospital for AIDS/HIV/TB) in Tumkur on 30th May 2016, which was presided by Dr. Mohandas (District DAPCU Officer) and duly attended by Mrs. Mohana Kumari (District Supervisor), Dr. Mamatha (Senior Medical Officer, ARTC Tumkur), and Dr. B.K. Rajkumar (Sr. Medical Officer, Dayasparsha Hospital). Further, 35 ICTC counselors, 37 laboratory technicians and 5 link ARTC staff nurses took part in the ensuing discussion.



The District Health officials were very appreciative of the medical services of Daysparsha Hospital to the rural community and recounted several benefits especially to the HIV infected patients. This would be considered as the only Hospital of its kind in Tumkur District as also within the adjoining regions that would be a blessing to the poor & afflicted.



The officials also suggested that a mini-operation room and gynaecology section for the HIV patients may add value and supplement the facilities.

This envisioned methods to tackle issues related to social discrimination and alleviating mental health concerns among rural areas of the district and benefits of counseling sessions (on education and employment opportunities) held at the Nagesh Memorial Counseling Unit in the Village Community Center, Hebbur.

Getting to Zero	HIV Infections	Access to practical, easy-to-understand information on how to prevent transmission of HIV, how to manage their health and HIV treatment, and where to go for care and support (Literacy/Counseling).
Getting to Zero	Discrimination	Protection against stigma and discrimination for people with HIV in areas as employment, housing and education (Education)
Getting to Zero	Deaths	Many are diagnosed late and therefore unable to receive the benefits of treatment. Starting treatment early with medical data will ensure best treatment for that situation (Pre-screening/medical campaign).
